#### - Introduction -

#### - Scenario -

You've recently begun making coffee at home and while you're happy with your results, you want to improve. A friend recommended trying out BRWR app. You've downloaded it, and are trying it out for the first time.

- Task (i.) "Proceed through welcome flow" -
- (a.) Navigate through the welcome process until you reach the main app. Please describe your impressions of and experience with the app as you navigate your way along.
- (b.) on the home page, please describe what you see, and what actions you think you can make.

- Task (ii.) "Add a coffee" -
- (a.) You understand BRWR can track how much coffee beans you have. How would you go about adding your current coffees to track?
- Task (iii.) "Connect user's smart gear" -

You own some smart devices (a bluetooth enabled coffee scale and bluetooth kettle). How would you go about connecting your devices?

- Task (iv.) "Find and add a Chemex recipe" -
- (a.) Now, you want to make a coffee and own a Chemex brewer. How do you expect to be able to do this?
- (b.) Your friend Matt suggests trying out his Chemex recipe, how would you go about finding his?
- Task (v.) "Choose to brew the added Chemex recipe" -
- (a.) Before you brew Matt's recipe, you notice the recipe makes 750g of coffee. That's too much for you. How would you go about changing this recipe so it makes 500g of coffee instead?
- (b.) After you change this, save keep the saved changes, rather than save as new.
- Task (vi.) "Proceed through brewing flow" -
- (a.) Now you can brew the recipe. Please describe your observations and experience as you navigate through the brewing instructions.
